

Regular Council September 18, 2018

Meeting came to order with Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call was answered by Cou. Gwinner, Broker, Kleber, Failor, Cox, & Robbins. Cou. Broker made motion to accept & dispense with reading minutes; 2nd by Cou. Kleber. Accepted by all. Cou. Gwinner made motion to pay bills; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mayor said the IworQ software has changed the one time fee from \$800 to \$500. The county will pay this for us. The annual fee for us would be \$1200. Cou. Broker suggests waiting until the new year and seeing if we can put it in the budget. Cou. Gwinner suggests asking them if we can wait until January of 2019.

Mayor said insurance company said it would cost \$8 per year for insuring the concession stand if we decide to lease it next year.

Police Chief said we cleared about \$8000 from the festival, after expenses. It was a lot of work but went well. She thanked Mayor and Cou. Kleber for their help.

Cou. Failor said the R2 district was discussed at planning & zoning meeting. They are putting numbers together to bring back to council.

Cou. Kleber said they are still working on the trash ordinance. They have a rough draft.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mayor thanked Jay Danklefsen and Darrell Holbrook for striping Bay View Drive.

Cou. Gwinner made motion to set aside rules on Ord. 2018-09 (defining the position of zoning inspector); 2nd by Cou. Broker. Accepted by all. Cou. Gwinner made motion to adopt Ord. 2018-09; 2nd by Cou. Broker. Accepted by all.

PUBLIC CONCERNS:

Resident expressed concern over brush grinding. He wants to know what the street department does. Mayor said they have been grinding lately. Police Chief said there was an unusual amount of damage from the recent storm. Cou. Broker said we need two people to do the grinding for safety reasons and we only have two people from Monday to Wednesday.

Resident asked if the noxious weed ordinance applies to tree branches. Solicitor said no. Resident said some of the problem is people putting garden waste in with the branches. Ray St. Marie thanked council and mayor for allowing parking for the Hot Harley Nights. He offered to make a \$1000 donation to the village to be used for landscaping on the bay front. (grass seed, perennials, etc.) Cou. Broker said we need to work on the watering issue. Ray also said the tree across from his business needs trimming.

Resident suggested considering the possibility of a garden club.

Cou. Broker made motion to adjourn; 2nd by Cou. Kleber.
