

Regular Council May 5, 2020

Meeting came to order with Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call was answered by Cou. Broker, Behrendt, Tully, Failor, Aichholz, & Robbins. Cou. Broker made motion to accept & dispense with reading minutes; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all. Cou. Broker made motion to pay bills; 2nd by Cou. Behrendt. Accepted by all.

OLD BUSINESS:

Cou. Behrendt handed out welcome letter. Mayor said local businesses could add flyers with menus, coupons, etc. to add in a packet with the letter. Council approved.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mayor said police department received state recognition in a recent assessment. They did very well and received three certificates.

Cou. Broker made motion to adopt Res. 2020-02 (1 mill recreation levy renewal); 2nd by Cou. Behrendt. Accepted by all.

Discussion on two trees that were previously approved to be removed by the village. The estimate has increased considerably and after some research, it was determined that one of the trees is not on village property. The other one is a property marker tree, which the village has not paid for in the past. Solicitor said (regarding previous motion), it was not a contract and the motion was for trees on village right of way, which these trees are not. Also, motion said for not more than \$1100. We have no obligation since these two issues fail to meet the motion. Cou. Broker asked solicitor to do some research.

Mayor would like to open the bridge and allow fishing along bayfront. Council approves.

PUBLIC CONCERNS:

Jim Lochotzki thanks council and mayor for finding a way to have the meeting open to the public, even in these unusual times.

Resident said he had a tree removed and the tree company's hydraulic line broke and fuel was spilled on the road. He asked if there was still a problem, and police chief said no, it was all taken care of. She said we had to call the fire department to make sure it was not hazardous.

Rays on the Bay would like official permission to put three picnic tables on the Bayfront, so customers can eat there, temporarily. (no alcohol allowed) Social distancing rules need to apply. There was some discussion. Cou. Broker made motion to allow Rayz to temporarily put three tables on the Bayfront (to be moved back each day) until the restaurant can open up fully; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all. Bay Bell is also included, if they would like to do the same.

Cou. Broker made motion to adjourn; 2nd by Cou. Aichholz.
