

Regular Council September 15, 2020

Meeting came to order with Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call was answered by Cou. Broker, Behrendt, Tully, James, Aichholz, & Robbins. Cou. Broker made motion to accept & dispense with reading minutes; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all. Cou. Broker made motion to pay bills; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all.

OLD BUSINESS:

Cou. Broker made motion to set aside rules on Ord. 2020-07 (rules on tree removal); 2nd by Cou. Behrendt. Accepted by all. Cou. Broker made motion to adopt Ord.2020-07; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all.

Cou. Broker made motion to set aside rules on Ord. 2020-08 (sale of surplus village owned property); 2nd by Cou. Behrendt; Accepted by all. Cou. Broker made motion to adopt Ord. 2020-08; 2nd by Cou. Behrendt. Accepted by all. Minimum bid amount is \$39,000 and bids will be opened Nov. 3.

NEW BUSINESS;

Police Chief asked permission to hire Bradley Griffin as part time patrolman. He will be replacing Jeremy Danklefsen who has resigned. He will be sworn in at next meeting.

Cou. Broker wants council to consider selling five lots on West Cayuga, possibly splitting lots. Solicitor said we might want to split lot 152 down the middle.

Cou. Behrendt gave update on planting trees. She has a friend who will donate saplings (oaks, maple, & sycamore). It is now a matter of finding a good time to get them.

Mayor said we need to consider options for having council meetings indoors again. We can get plastic dividers to separate village officials. We need to figure out how to have the residents participate, possibly through electronics. Cou. Broker suggested the fire station.

PUBLIC CONCERNS:

Some new residents (bought lots on Cherokee Trail) complained that they are having a difficult time getting things approved through our zoning department. They have been trying to get a permit from zoning inspector with no luck. Mayor will call Ron Cox and get answers and get back to them. Zoning board president Tony Kaiser said he has all their paperwork and can get it to the mayor.

Nancy Hannon said pots are in place on the Bayfront. By October 1st, they will be decorated. There are sign up flyers at the businesses.
