

Regular Council January 19, 2021

Meeting came to order with Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call was answered by Cou. Broker, Behrendt, Tully, James, & Robbins. Cou. Aichholz was absent. Cou. Broker made motion to accept & dispense with reading minutes; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all. Cou. Broker made motion to pay bills; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all.

NEW BUSINESS:

Cou. Robbins made motion to hold village wide garage sales the 2nd weekend of June; 2nd by Cou. Behrendt. Accepted by all.

Discussion on possible catfish tournament. Bill Ladley is in charge. It is affiliated with the American Catfish Association. They would like to have it a Saturday in June. Entry fees would be donated to the village. Mayor and Jim Johnson and possibly another council member will meet with Mr. Ladley to discuss issues (parking, vendors, etc.). Then we will discuss with solicitor. We will let them choose either the 3rd or 4th Saturday in June.

Discussion on “no wake buoys” in the back bay. Mayor will have meeting with Chuck Fresch from Property Owners Association to discuss. Solicitor said if Mayor signs paperwork, it could bring liability to the village. Maybe village could adopt a resolution and the Property Owners Association could sign paperwork. Mayor will work with association and ODNR.

Mayor has had complaints regarding signs in yards. According to the 1st amendment, people have the right to express feelings as long as there is no threat or obscenity.

NEW BUSINSS FROM FLOOR:

Police Chief said the new police car is here and thanks everyone for their efforts. We still need to get a radio.

Assistant Fire Chief said Perkins Fire Dept. is selling us a 2006 Yukon for \$1. Solicitor will prepare an ordinance accepting it. Cou. Behrendt made motion to accept the 2006 Yukon from the Perkins Fire Dept; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all.

PUBLIC CONCERNS:

Daryl Pasek expressed concerns regarding the catfish tournament. Solicitor said we have governmental immunity. Mr. Pasek also said we need to make a decision on getting a building for the equipment.

Cou. Broker made motion to adjourn; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all.
