Regular Council March 5, 2019

## OLD BUSINESS:

Discussion on grass cutting. Cou. Broker made motion to hire Coy Slemp for grass cutting for 2019 at \$250 per cutting, under the direction of mayor and maintenance department; 2<sup>nd</sup> by Cou. Gwinner. Accepted by all.

Mayor said we need stone at the fire and police stations. Estimates for the amount maintenance dept. thinks we need range from \$5000 to \$10,000. Cou. Failor suggests we start by getting a small amount for now and see how that goes, gradually adding more over time. Cou. Broker suggests we get one load with our truck from Erie Blacktop and see how far it goes.

Mayor said we lost some shingles on village hall building. Maintenance department will replace them when weather permits.

Cou. Broker attended Erie Regional Planning meeting, which focused on the upcoming 2020 census.

Cou. Broker made motion to adjourn; 2<sup>nd</sup> by Cou. Behrendt.
