Meeting came to order with Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call was answered by Cou. Broker, Behrendt, Gwinner, Failor, & Robbins. Cou. Aichholz was absent. Cou. Broker made motion to accept & dispense with reading minutes; 2nd by Cou. Behrendt. Accepted by all. Cou. Broker made motion to accept reports; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all. Cou. Broker made motion to pay bills; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all.

OLD BUSINESS:

Cou. Gwinner and Solicitor looked at Chickasaw Trail after last meeting. Solicitor does not think it is normal wear & tear. He will look at our agreement with the county and see if there is any remedy.

Solicitor will make recommended changes on dock ordinance and send it out for council to look over before next meeting.

Recreation committee met. Mayor asked residents on Facebook if they prefer a traditional trick or treat or a "trunks for treats" at the park.

Response was for traditional. We will have it Oct. 31st from 6-8 pm.

Mayor said more barrels on pier were dumped and burned. The sinkhole was filled in. Yesterday there was an injured eagle, which people on pier would not leave alone. Bridge was closed until Back to the Wild came and took the eagle.

Cou. Broker made motion to remove two trees, which are on village right of way, for not more than \$1100 for both; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all.

NEW BUSINESS:

Cou. Broker made motion to adopt Res. 2019-06 (accepting tax levies and rates as set by budget commission); 2nd by Cou. Gwinner. Accepted by all.

Mayor said maintenance dept. painted shelter at park. No word on red truck yet. We will check at end of week. White truck needs new tires. Extenders also need replaced. On way to get tires, truck stalled out.

Police Chief would like council to consider extending time people have to comply with junk vehicle ordinance from five days to 30 days. Pig roast is this Saturday.

PUBLIC CONCERNS:

Vicki Starr (Grand Pass) questioned junk cars. She gave input she has found from other municipalities.

Cindy Tully (Sunset Plaza) questioned lawns that need mowed. Mayor explained procedure.

Chuck Fresch (Seneca Trail) said there are many cracks in roads, not just Chickasaw. He suggests a road maintenance plan for repairs. He also questioned which trees we remove. Mayor said only ones that are on village right of way. This has been an ongoing problem for years.

Nancy Hannon (Oneida Trail) asked if we are going to finish the storm sewer-stenciling program. Mayor said probably, since Melissa Feliciano is back from leave now.
