

Regular Council October 5, 2021

Meeting came to order with Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call was answered by Cou. Broker, Behrendt, Tully, James, Aichholz, & Robbins. Cou. Broker made motion to accept & dispense with reading minutes; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all. Cou. Broker made motion to accept reports; 2nd by Cou. Behrendt. Accepted by all. Cou. Broker made motion to pay bills; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all.

OLD BUSINESS:

Discussion on amending zoning ordinance, regarding pools. Solicitor handed out a rough draft for discussion. Cou. Aichholz also handed out paperwork. Items discussed were fence height, spacing of fencing, and illumination. Solicitor will put together a revised rough draft for next meeting.

Discussion on use of American Rescue Plan funds. Mayor would like to see storm sewers cleaned. Cou. Broker would rather investigate addressing the flooding problem at the village hall. Possibly a back-flow device. Mayor said we received \$31,000 this year and will get another \$31,000 next year, so we may have enough money to do all of this. Meanwhile, council agreed to rebuild the pump. Cou. Broker made motion to have the pump rebuilt for not more than \$8150; 2nd by Cou. Behrendt. Accepted by all.

Mayor gave update on Veterans' Day event. We are scaling things down a bit. Instead of chili, there will be cake, finger food, hot chocolate & coffee. We will have songs, flag raising, and recognition of local veterans. This will be from 3 – 5pm on Veterans Day. We will have another meeting the end of October to finalize plans.

NEW BUSINESS:

Cou. Broker made motion to purchase leaf vac adapter boot and hose for truck box, for not more than \$800; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all.

Cou. Behrendt said the drum set for the park is here. We will be reimbursed when it is installed and pictures sent in. Mayor thanks Cou. Behrendt & Cou. James for their work on this project.

PUBLIC CONCERNS:

Bruce Richardson voiced concerns about derelict properties (accumulation of unlicensed vehicles, boats, and also trash). Mayor said to give zoning inspector the address and he will go there tomorrow. The police chief will look into the boats and vehicles.

Cou. Broker made motion to adjourn; 2nd by Cou. Robbins. Accepted by all.
