

Regular Council March 21, 2023

Meeting came to order with Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call was answered by Cou. S. Broker, Behrendt, James, K. Broker, & Grieger. Cou. Aichholz was absent. Cou. S. Broker made motion to accept & dispense with reading minutes; 2nd by Cou. Behrendt. Accepted by all. Cou. S. Broker made motion to pay bills; 2nd by Cou. Grieger. Accepted by all.

NEW BUSINESS:

Steve Congdon asked permission of council to hold a sunrise service on Easter Sunday at the gazebo by the hall. Council said fine.

Cou. S. Broker made motion to hire Tim Nichols for part time, as needed maintenance worker; 2nd by Cou. K. Broker. Accepted by all.

Discussion on putting a recycling bin in the village. Council decided against it, due to the misuse the last time we had one. Also, the trash haulers in the village offer recycling services.

Discussion on Mylander Grant: Cou. S. Broker suggests replacing some benches and adding a couple of swings. Mayor suggests the shoreline committee get more involved with the recreation grants that pertain to the shoreline.

Discussion on Erie Metroparks Grant: This is a reimbursement grant. We would like to continue with the musical theme. Cou. Behrendt handed out papers on possible musical instruments to add to the park. Cou. Grieger made motion to spend up to \$5000 for this grant; 2nd by Cou. S. Broker. Accepted by all.

Mayor said electrician's estimate to remove electrical pole at park was \$5000. This is too much money, so we will go with plan B. Put another pole in and move box over.

Mayor said the survey mailings are ready. Clerk will stuff them in envelopes, stamp them, and mail.

Mayor contacted homeowners who had junk by the road and all has been removed.

PUBLIC CONCERNS:

Resident questioned legal height for fences and getting copies of surveys. Solicitor said this is a private matter between two landowners and the village is not involved.

Resident said the drums by the park are a noise nuisance (She lives by park). Kids are banging on them after park is closed for the night. She was told to call police department and make a report when this happens.
