

Regular Council April 4, 2023

Meeting came to order with Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call was answered by Cou. S. Broker, Behrendt, James, Grieger, & Aichholz. Cou. K. Broker was absent. Cou. S. Broker made motion to accept & dispense with reading minutes; 2nd by Cou. Behrendt. Accepted by all. Cou. Aichholz made motion to pay bills; 2nd by Cou. S. Broker. Accepted by all. Cou. S. Broker made motion to accept reports; 2nd by Cou. Grieger. Accepted by all.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mayor met with Sunrise Fuel. Fuel tanks will need to be moved before new building can be put up. We are still getting figures on this.

NEW BUSINESS:

Cou. Grieger made motion to allow planting of an oak tree with a bench on the bayfront, in memory of long time resident; 2nd by Cou. S. Broker. Accepted by all.

Cou. Grieger made motion to allow mayor to spend up to \$3000 on a small building at the pump station; 2nd by Cou. S. Broker. Accepted by all.

Rex is working on coming up with a budget amount for the flower baskets on the bayfront.

The shoreline committee will look into benches through the Mylander Foundation. Cou. James is working on grant for a small house for the park (Santa or Easter Bunny)

Zoning board recommends that we update the zoning ordinance to not allow campers on commercial property. Council is ok with this.

Cou. Aichholz gave some numbers on a street levy. Each mill would bring in about \$15,700 per year. 4 mills would bring in \$60,000 per year. He is looking at possibility of putting this on the ballot next spring.

Mayor and Cou. Grieger are meeting with Corps of Engineers next week to discuss possible grant for erosion on the bayfront.

PUBLIC CONCERNS:

Police Chief said the Easter Egg Hunt went well. They could have used more help. Also, she suggested asking EHOVE about possibility of students to help with putting up a building.

Cou. S. Broker made motion to adjourn; 2nd by Cou. Behrendt.
