Council asked solicitor to move forward with drafting an ordinance to protect domesticated feral wildlife in the village.

Cou. James made motion to purchase Christmas decorations for the Santa House for \$500; 2nd by Cou. Behrendt. Accepted by all.

Mayor thanks police dept, fire dept, and many residents that helped out after the storm. Emergency Management Agency helped us out a little bit last week. We will continue chipping street by street until done.
