

Regular Council May 19, 2026

Meeting came to order with Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call was answered by Cou. K. Broker, Grieger, Brace, S. Broker, Drossman, & Fresch. Cou. K. Broker made motion to accept & dispense with reading minutes; 2nd by Cou. Geiger. Accepted by all. Cou. K. Broker made motion to pay bills; 2nd by Cou. Geiger. Accepted by all.

OLD BUSINESS:

Discussion on modifying Ord. 2019-03 & 2006-03 & 2006-04. (regarding weed cutting and nuisances). Solicitor recommends that the grass and weeds ordinance stand-alone (separating it from the other nuisances like litter, junk, etc.) Cou. K. Broker directed solicitor to prepare ordinances and send to council for their consideration. Cou. Drossman made motion to go to executive session to discuss legal matter: 2nd by Cou. K. Broker. Accepted by all. Meeting broke for 25 minutes. Cou. K. Broker made motion to go back to regular session; 2nd by Cou. Grieger. Accepted by all. Council wants to separate the two ordinances (grass, weeds, & other junk nuisances). They want a 14-day verbal warning and then a 30-day written warning, then starting a \$50 per day fine for 30 days.

NEW BUSINESS:

Clerk handed out a proposed cybersecurity police for the village. Council will review it and come to next meeting prepared to discuss. The state is requiring all governments to adopt a policy by July 1st.

Mayor spoke to realtor regarding an appraisal for Cody Pass. He just got the realtor's report before the council meeting. He will print the report and give to council to discuss at next meeting.

Cou. Brace wants each department to develop a succession plan. (a 5, 10- and 15-year plan.) Committees for fire and police will meet with chiefs and Mayor will meet with street department and bring information back to council.

PUBLIC CONCERNS:

Jim Lochotzki reported that he was recently transported by the Bay View rescue squad and they did a very good, professional job.
